The following provisions of the Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during inspection on 27/12/2021 by the undersigned & Mr Vinod D Godghate (CVO), in presence of Mr Mahipal Solanky, Geologist, and Mr Rajendra Singh Lahariya.

During the inspection it was found that following provisions of rule have been violated
		 Bench parameters are not maintained as per proposal, as high wall is created. Crushing unit, OB Dump & part of mineral stock have been found outside the lease area. Boundary pillars are not maintained properly as per rule.
	Rule 11(4)	The holder of mining lease shall submit the mining plan to the competent authority for review at least 180 (one hundred and eighty days) before the expiry of five years period for which it was approved on the last occasion, for mining operations for a period of five subsequent years
		In your case, last Scheme of Mining was approved vide letter No. MP/Gwalior/Iron Ore/RMP-67/2016-17 dated 30.11.2017 for the period 2017-18 to 2021-22 and as per the prescribed rule next Review of Mining Plan not submitted at least 180 days before to the Regional Controller of Mines, Jabalpur & thus violated above provision of this rule.
	Rule 26(2)	The holder of mining lease shall submit a yearly report as per the format specified before 1st July of every year setting forth the extent of protective and rehabilitative work carried out as envisaged in the approved mine closure plan, and if there is any deviation, reason thereof

- In this connection it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of MCDR-2017.
- Non-compliance of the rule 11(1) & of MCDR-2017 may lead to suspension of Mining operations under the provisions of rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017.
- You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within 45 (Forty-Five) days from the date of issue of this letter.
