HIMACHAL PRADESH

Mineral Resources

The State is the sole holder of country's Antimony ore and rock salt resources. Limestone and shale are the important minerals produced in the State. **Barytes** occurs in Sirmaur district; **limestone** in Bilaspur, Chamba, Kangra, Kulu, Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur & Solan districts; and **rock salt** in Mandi district. Other minerals that occur in the State are **antimony** in Lahaul & Spiti districts; **gypsum** in Chamba, Sirmaur and Solan districts; **magnesite** in Chamba district; **pyrite** in Shimla district; and **quartz**, **quartzite** & **silica sand** in Una district Table - 1.

Exploration & Development

No mineral exploration activites reported by any State government agency during 2016-17. However, GSI carried out exploration activity for dolomite in Bilapur district. Details are furnished in Table-2.

Production

Limestone is the principal mineral produced in the state during 2016-17.

The value of minor minerals' production was estimated at `63 crore for the year 2016-17.

The number of reporting mines in the state was 21 in 2016-17, all belongs to limestone. Details are furnished in Table-3.

Bilaspur	Parnali and Tattapani						G4 stage reconnaissance survey for low silica dolomite was taken up in Parnali & Tattapani formations of the Shali group by large-scale mapping, three bands of dolomite have been delineated. Band L-1: Dolomite band of Parnali Formation is in lensoidal shape and established over a strike length of 13.7 km with average width of about 450 m. Band L-2(A). The dolomite band of Tattapani Formation is exposed at Barog-Ghagas-Bharatu area. The dolomite band is about 430 m in thickness, traced for about 12.2 km Shale parting (2-16 cm) has been identified within the dolomite. Band L-2 (B).
