Scrutiny remarks on Review of mining plan and PMCP for Sholapuram Limestone mine over 1.06.07 ha. In Sholapuram village, Rajapalayam taluk, Virudhunagar district of M/s Vijesh Chemicals.

General:

- On cover page, lease period, date of expiry and mine code not given which may be checked and corrected. Also review of mining plan period starts from April 2016 onwards, which may be checked and corrected
- 2. The lease deed was signed by Sri. G. Sankar whereas document was signed by Smt. R.Chandra managing partner. This may be clarified.
- 3. Permanent and present address needs to be indicated with documentary proof.
- 4. Copy of photo ID of lessee/applicant(s) needs to be enclosed along with document.
- 5. All the certificates of lessee and qualified person prepared the document should be kept at Part-B of report.
- a. Reserves and resources: Reserves and resources are not drawn as per the UNFC norms and not followed the prescribed format. : In the absence of exploration carried out, the proved reserves under UNFC code III may be considered from the existing pit level. Accordingly, necessary changes may be made in the text part of the report.
- 6. Mining: No approved mining document for the last 14 years but mine is working and producing production up to 2011-12. Which may be clarified?
- 7. Copies of EC & PC may be submitted.

Plates:

- 1. All proposals should be within lease area, leaving 7.5m all along the lease boundary and accordingly be mentioned in text also. .
- 2. Plate no-II: Lease plan may be authenticated by State Govt. authority. Three GCP photographs may be submitted.
- 3. Plate no-III: Surface plan: During the field visit it was found that few stack yards are noticed in the mine which may be shown.
- 4. Plate no-IV: Geological plan and sections: Uniform cross-sections may be drawn and proved, probable and possible limits may be marked in the sections as per UNFC norms. Proved reserves may be estimated up to the existing pit limit since no exploration was carried out. A fresh reserves and resources may be estimated.
- 5. Document has not been prepared as per prevailing guidelines. Universal guidelines may be followed for preparation of document.
