

| Rule 11 | <p>Rule 11(1) Mining operations under mining lease.--(1) No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 or approved by the competent authority of the Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research, in respect of minerals specified in Part B of the First Schedule to the Act where the grade of such atomic minerals is equal to or above the threshold value limits declared under Schedule-A of the Atomic Minerals Concession Rules, 2016.</p> <p>1. stripping ratio ie ore : waste ratio achieved is 1:0.06 instead of 1:26 which is planned indicating development is on lower side.<br/>2. reclamation and backfilling both have been less than planned.it is only 500m2 instead of planned 10000 m2.</p>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                      |
| Rule 45 | <p>45(5) .The holder of a mining lease shall submit online returns in respect of each mine to the Regional Controller or any other authorised official of the Indian Bureau of Mines in the following manner, namely:-<br/>(b) a monthly return which shall be submitted before the tenth day of every month in respect of the preceding month in electronic form along with a signed print copy of the same if it is not digitally signed, in the respective form as indicated below:-<br/>i. for all minerals except copper, gold, lead, pyrite, tin, tungsten, zinc, precious and semi-precious stones, in Form F1 of the Schedule;<br/>ii. for copper, gold, lead, pyrite, tin, tungsten and zinc, in Form F2 of the Schedule; and<br/>iii. for precious and semi-precious stones, in Form F3 of the Schedule;<br/>(c) an annual return which shall be submitted before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July each year for the preceding financial year in electronic form, along with a signed print copy of the same if it is not digitally signed, in the respective Form as indicated below:-<br/>(i) for all minerals except copper, gold, lead, pyrite, tin, tungsten, zinc, precious and semi-precious stones, in Form G1 of the Schedule;<br/>(ii) for copper, gold, lead, pyrite, tin, tungsten and zinc, in Form G2 of the Schedule;<br/>(iii) for precious and semi-precious stones, in Form G3 of the Schedule:</p> <p><i>In annual returns submitted</i></p> <p>i) <i>The information on appointment of mining engineer and geologist appointed is not provided.</i></p> |
| Rule 26 | <p>26. Responsibility of holder of a mining lease.- (1) The holder of a mining lease shall have the responsibility to ensure that the protective measures including reclamation and rehabilitation works have been carried out in accordance with the approved mine closure plan or with such modifications as approved by the competent authority.<br/>(2) The holder of mining lease shall submit to the competent authority a yearly report as per the format specified by the Indian Bureau of Mines, before 1st day of July every year setting forth the extent of protective and rehabilitative works carried out as envisaged in the approved mine closure plan, and if there is any deviation, reasons thereof.<br/>The required template under above rule has not been filled for mine.</p> <p><i>The required yearly report under above rule has not been submitted for mine.</i></p>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                     |

04. Please note that no further notice will be given to you in this regard.




