Subject: Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017, in respect to Ispat Limestone Quarry ML-I, 590.522 Hectare in District Satna, Madhya Pradesh.

Sir,

Undersigned has inspected your mine in the presence of QP and Mine official Shri Sanjay Baghel on dated 24/02/2021. Following provisions of MCDR 2017 were found violated in your mines at the time of inspection.

Nature of violation observed in detail

The site inspection was carried out for the submitted draft Review of Mining Plan incorporating proposals for next five years, the deviation observed during inspection are as under:

**Rule 11 (1)** No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared.

*It is observed that you have not achieved the proposal said in the mining plan in terms of Exploration, Development and Production, details as below-*

- *In year 2019-20 & 2020-21 it was proposed to drill 40 & 43 nos of boreholes respectively with total meterage 2490 meters, which is not achieved.*
- *Against proposal, for the production of 1972085 tonnes of limestone you have produced only 570146.450 tonnes of limestone in the year 2020-21. (28.91 % achievement) vis-a vis development work was also lagging behind distorting the stripping ratio.*

**Rule 11(4)** The holder of a mining lease shall submit the mining plan to the competent authority for review at least one hundred and eighty days before the expiry of five years period for which it was approved on the last occasion, for mining operations for a period of five subsequent years.

- *Your last plan was approved on dated 06/03/2017, incorporating proposals from 2016-17 to 2020-21, as on date your last approved mining plan has been expired.*

2. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017.
3. The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 is not found satisfactory.
4. You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within 30 (Thirty) days from the date of issue of this letter.
