Subject: Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017, in respect to Sindursi Heamatite (Iron Ore) Mine (9.00 Ha), M/s Jai Minerals in Jabalpur district.

Sir,

Undersigned has inspected your mine in the presence of your re-presentatives Sh Bijendra Singh Chauhan and other mine officials on 27/01/2021. Following provisions of MCDR 2017 were found violated in your mines at the time of inspection.

Rule No	Nature of violation observed in detail
Rule 11(1)	<p>No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 or approved by the competent authority of the Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research, in respect of minerals specified in Part B of the First Schedule to the Act where the grade of such atomic minerals is equal to or above the threshold value limits declared under Schedule-A of the Atomic Minerals Concession Rules, 2016.</p> <p>The Modification in Approved Mining Plan of above mentioned mine was approved vide letter No.-MP/Jabalpur/Iron Ore/M.Sch-112/14-15/2823, Jabalpur dated 06-05-2015 incorporating proposal of working from 2015-16 to 2019-20.</p> <p>(a) Mine development was not done against the proposal to remove 2350 m³ overburden from the pit in the year 2019-20.</p> <p>(b) Plantation was not done against the proposal of 45 plants in the green belt of lease area for afforestation in the 400 m² area.</p> <p>(c) In the Southern boundary of the Pit No.2 and some other places the benches have been merged up resulting height of the benches found more than the proposal. And, it was also observed that at some places in the Northern side between BP no. 3D and BP no. 3C width of the benches found very less than approved in the document.</p>
Rule 26(2)	<p>The holder of mining lease shall submit to the competent authority a yearly report as per the format specified by the Indian Bureau of Mines, before 1st day of July every year setting forth the extent of protective and rehabilitative works carried out as envisaged in the approved mine closure plan, and if there is any deviation, reasons thereof:</p> <p>The yearly report in respect of rule 26(2) of MCDR 2017 has not been submitted for the previous approved plan period.</p>
Rule 33	<p>Copies of updated plans and sections to be submitted – The holder of mining lease shall on or before the 30th day of the June every year submit to the authorized officer, as the case may be, and the State Govt. a digital copy along with a print copy of the surface geological plans and sections maintained under rule 32.</p> <p>Copies of updated plans and sections under rule 32 of MCDR-2017 have not been submitted.</p>
Rule 55 (1)	<p>For the purpose of carrying out reconnaissance, prospecting or mining operations in accordance with these rules, –</p> <p>(a) every holder of reconnaissance permit shall employ a whole-time geologist;</p> <p>(b) every holder of prospecting licence or a prospecting license-cum-mining lease shall employ a whole-time geologist and a part-time mining engineer;</p> <p>(c) every holder of a mining lease shall employ, in case of–</p>

category 'A' mines, a whole-time mining engineer and a geologist;
category 'B' mines, a part-time mining engineer and a part-time geologist:
Provided that in the case of fully mechanised category 'A' mines, the mining engineers and geologists shall have minimum five years of professional experience of working in a supervisory capacity in the field of mining.
Whole time Mining Engineer and Geologist have not been appointed for this lease area as per provisions of rule.


1. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservations and Development Rules, 2017.
2. The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 is not found satisfactory.
3. You are advised to rectify the violations of abovementioned rules immediately and intimate the position to this office within 45 (Forty Five) days from the date of issue of this letter.
