On examination of this office records and as per the inspection of your mine by the undersigned on 30/08/2015, it is observed that the following provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development (Amendment) Rules, 1988 amended vide notification of GSR 75(E) dated 09.02.2011 are violated in respect of your above referred mine:

above referred mine:
Nature of violations observed
As per Rule 42, employment of Mining Engineer and Geologist has not been done.
If it is found that the owner, agent, mining engineer or manager of mine or the person or company engaged in trading or storage or end-use or export of minerals, as the case may be, has submitted incomplete or wrong or false information in monthly or special or annual returns or fails to submit a return within the date specified, -  (i) in the case of mining of minerals by the owner, agent, mining engineer or manager of mine, then the Regional Controller of Mines may,-  (a) order suspension of all mining operations in the mine and may revoke the order of suspension only after ensuring proper compliance;  (b) take action to initiate prosecution under these rules;  (c)recommend termination of the mining lease, in case such suppression or misrepresentation of information indicates abetment or connivance of illegal mining;
However, the following shortcomings were observed in the Annual Returns submitted for the year 2014-15:-  (i) Under the land use details given in item 12 of Part-I, abandoned area has been mentioned while no such area exists. It is also contradicting rule 23(1) of MCDR'1988.  (ii) Under item no. 2 of Part-II, reasons for closure of mines have not been clearly mentioned.  (iii) Grade of mineral reject should be mentioned clearly in terms of alumina and

silica contents under Part-V.

- (i) Reserves mentioned under part-V at the end of year are incorrect.
- (iv) Depth of the deepest working mentioned is incorrect.
- (v) While there is no quantity backfilled, how area is mentioned under 'reclaimed and rehabilitated' category?

These violations may lead to suspension of all mining operations in the mine as well as termination of mining lease and prosecution of the owner, agent and manager.

- 02. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that, the above violation of said rule constitutes an offence punishable under Rule 58 of MCDR, 1988.
- 03. You are, therefore, <u>advised to rectify the above violation immediately and intimate the position</u> to this office within 45 days from the receipt of this letter.

Please note that no further notice will be given to you in this regard.
