Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation & Development (Amendment) Rules, 2021, in respect of your Kattupiringiyam Limestone Mine over an area of 44.58 Ha in Periyanagalur & Valanjanagaram Village, Ariyalur Taluk & District, Tamil Nadu.

Sir,

The following provisions of the MCD(A)R, 2021 were found violated in your above mine during the inspection on 05/12/2022 by undersigned in presence of mine official Shri K. Nagendran, Mine Manager & Shri P. Senthamilselvan, AGM (Geology):

11(1)	Mining operations have not been carried out as per the Review of Mining Plan approved vide Letter No. TN/ALR/LST/ROMP-1574.MDS dated 15.11.2019 to the extent as mentioned below:  (i) There was a proposal to remove 70,880 m³ of Top Soil during the year 2021-22 against which only 9,385 m³ of Top Soil was removed during the year.  (ii) There was a proposal to remove 5,21,760 m³ of Overburden during the year 2021-22 against which no Overburden has been removed during the year.  (iii) There was a proposal to maintain the Ore to OB ratio of 1:1.69 during the year 2021-22 against which the same was maintained at 1:0.03 during the year.  (iv) There was a proposal to backfill 3.13 Ha of mined out area during the year 2021-22 against which only 0.95 Ha has been backfilled during the year.

- 02. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62(1) of Mineral Conservation and Development (Amendment) Rules, 2021, with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to rupees five lakhs, or with both, and in the case of a continuing contravention, with additional fine which may extend to rupees fifty thousand for every day during which such contravention continues after conviction for the first such contravention.
- 03. The mining operation can be suspended under Rule 11(2), if the compliance of Rule 11(1) is not found satisfactory
- 04. You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within 45 (Forty Five) days from the date of issue of this letter.
