The following provisions of the Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during the inspection by undersigned on 14.12.22 in presence of Shri Mordhwaj Mishra, Lessees' representative are detailed as below -:

Rule 11 (1)	<p><b><i>According to this rule-No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operation in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines;</i></b></p> <p>The Review of Mining Plan of above mentioned mine was approved vide this office letter No-MP/Satna/Limestone/RMP-36/2020-21 dated 02.02.2021 and following deviations/violations have been observed during mine inspection in accordance with approved proposals of ROMP-</p> <p>i) As per the para 1(i) of Geology &amp; exploration chapter, under the future exploration programme, total 09 core boreholes during the year 2021-22 and 11 core boreholes in 2022-23 were proposed. Rule 26(2)	<p><b><i>The holder of mining lease shall submit a yearly report as per the format specified before 1<sup>st</sup> July of every year setting forth the extent of protective and rehabilitative work carried out as envisaged in the approved mine closure plan, and if there is any deviation, reason thereof</i></b></p> <p>Aforesaid report in prescribe Form for the year 2021-22 was not submitted to the Regional Controller of Mine, Jabalpur till the date of inspection.</p>																				

Rule 27(1)	<p>The Mineral Conservation &amp; Development (Amendment) Rules, 2021 Notified by Gazette of India, Notification date 03/11/2021. As per Rule 27(1)(i) of Mineral Conservation &amp; Development (Amendment) Rules, 202, which is for financial assurance the following provisions have been made in the rule which is reproduced as:</p> <p>(i) for the words and letters “three lakh rupees for Category „A“ mines and two lakh rupees for Category “B” mines”, the words and letters “five lakh rupees for Category “A” mines and three lakh rupees for Category „B“ mines” shall be substituted;</p> <p>Provided that the minimum amount of financial assurance to be furnished under sub-rule (1), shall be ten lakh rupees for Category ‘A’ mines and five lakh rupees for Category ‘B’ mines:</p> <p>As per the last Review of Mining Plan was approved vide letter No. MP /Satna / Limestone / RMP-36/2020-21 dated 02.02.2021, the Financial Assurance was furnished by you @ Rs. 3 lakh per hectare for the total 14.25 hectare mining lease area put to use for mining and allied activities bearing BG No-0116820BG0000011 for <b>Rs. 48,00,000/-</b> valid up to <b>31/03/2024</b>. Thus, additional/differential financial assurance of <b>Rs. 23,25,000/-</b> in the form of Bank Guarantee with a validity upto <b>30/09/2024</b> is required to be submitted as per the provisions of this rule at the earliest to this office.</p>
Rule 34A(2)	<p><i>Every lessee, other than those covered under sub-rule (1), shall submit soft copy of high resolution Georeferenced Ortho-rectified Multispectral satellite images of the leased area and upto hundred metres outside the lease boundary taken in the month of April to June of every year, to the Controller General on or before 1st day of July of the that year in the standards formats such as GeoTIFF along with metadata or any other format as may be specified by the Indian Bureau of Mines in this regard:</i></p> <p>But, during inspection it was observed that, you have not submitted soft copy of high resolution Geo-referenced Ortho-rectified Multispectral satellite images of the leased area and up to hundred metres outside the lease boundary to this office.</p>

02. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of MCDR, 2017.
03. The non-compliance of the rule 11(1) of MCDR, 2017 may lead to suspension of Mining operations under the provisions of rule 11(2) of MCDR, 2017.
04. You are therefore advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within 45 (Forty Five) days from the date of issue of this letter.
