Sub: - Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 in respect of your **Goraiya Limestone Mine** over an extent of **7.331 hectares** (Mine Code 38MPR35303) situated in village Goraiya, Tehsil – Kotar, District Satna of Madhya Pradesh State.

Sir,

Following provisions of MCDR, 2017 were found violated in your above mine during the inspection by Shri Akash Arun Mittarwar, Assistant Mining Engineer on 24/09/2024 in the presence of Shri Anil Kumar Kushwaha (Geologist) & Shri Sanjeev Singh Parihar (Mining Engineer) as follows:-

11(1)	<p>No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 or approved by the competent authority of the Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research, in respect of minerals specified in Part B of the First Schedule to the Act where the grade of such atomic minerals is equal to or above the threshold value limits declared under Schedule-A of the Atomic Minerals Concession Rules, 2016.</p> <p>The Review of Mining Plan of above mentioned mine was approved vide letter No.-MP/Satna/Limestone/RMP/-40/2021-22 dated 12/11/2021 incorporating proposal of working from the period 2021-22 to 2025-26 having validity up to 31/03/2026; during the inspection following violations were observed: -</p> <p>1. It was proposed to generate 154564 tonnes of limestone production during the year 2023-24 but, only 85717 tonnes of limestone production is achieved; therefor, 44% of deviation is observed in respect to approved proposal.</p>
33	<p>The holder of a mining lease shall, on or before the 30th day of June every year submit to the authorized Officer, as the case may be, and the State Government, a digital copy along with a print copy of the surface geological plans and sections maintained under rule 32.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copies of plans and sections under rule 32 of MCDR-2017 have not been submitted.

45(7)	<p>If it is found that the holder of a mineral concession or the person or company engaged in trading or storage or end-use or export or import of minerals, as the case may be, has submitted incomplete or wrong or false information in monthly or annual returns or fails to submit a return within the date specified;-</p> <p>Refer PART-I Upload Document -</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In submitted Annual return of 2023-24, PART-VI (PRODUCTION, DESPATCHES AND STOCKS) (LIMESTONE), in table 2. Production and Stocks of ROM ore at Mine-head – production is given as 189591 tonnes but, in table 3(ii) Grade-wise Production, Dispatches, Stocks and Ex-mine prices it is mentioned as 85717 tonnes which is contradictory. 2. It was proposed to generate 38641 tonnes of Mineral Reject during the year 2023-24 but, nil is reported in submitted Annual return of 2023-24. 3. Balance resources as on 31.3.2024 is to be furnished after depleting actual production of limestone from reserves during the year 2023-24.

2. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservations and Development Rules, 2017.
3. The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 read with MCDR-2021 (Amendment) if, not found satisfactory.
4. The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 45(7) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 45(7) of MCDR-2017 read with MCDR-2021 (Amendment) if, not found satisfactory.
5. You are advised to rectify the violations of above-mentioned rules immediately and intimate the position to this office within **45 (Forty-Five) days** from the date of issue of this letter.
