Sub.: Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017, in respect to **Badari Limestone Mine**, (Mine Code 38MPR18025), **Area** 5.76 hectares, situated in village Barahiya, Satna District of Madhya Pradesh State.

Madam,

The following provision of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during the inspection by the undersigned on 04.10.24 in presence of Shri Arvind Baburao Jade (Mines Head), Shri. Venkateshwarlu STKKS Manager(Geology)

Rule 11(1).	<p><i>Mining operations under mining lease.-(1) No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 During inspection it has been observed that the following provisions of the rule have been violated: -</i></p> <p>i). For the reporting year 2023-24 the development is proposed in between N 456501 to N 456630 and E 2657999 to E 2658081 whereas the deviation in proposed location is observed.</p> <p>ii). 31806 Tof ROM was produced against the proposed production of 49950 T during 2023-2024 which distorting the proposal by 36%.</p>

2. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 and that non-compliance of rule 12 (4) shall be punishable with fine of Rs 5,00,000/-.
3. Non-compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR, 2017 may lead to suspension of mining operation under the provision of rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017.
4. You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within a period of 45 days from the date of issue of this letter.
