Sub.: Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017, in respect of **Chandan Limestone Mine Mine Code 38MPR18105** over an extent of 5.605 ha in Katni District of M..P.

Sir,

The following provision of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during the inspection by the undersigned on 28.06.2024 in presence of **Shri. Adthiya Bagaria** (Lessee Representative) **and Shri Mratunjay Prasasd** (Mining Engineer).

Rule No	Nature of violation observed in detail		
Rule 11(1)	No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5. i. Nine boreholes proposed during 2022-23 which is not been carried out. ii. 50 m of retaining wall and 60 m of garland drain proposed during the Reporting year which has not been carried out. iii. Mining Lease Boundary pillars has not been established at precise locations. iv. Proposed to plant 210 saplings in 7.5 barrier zone which was not carried out.		
Rule 31(4)	The plans and sections required under these rules shall be maintained up to date within three months in case of category 'A' mines as referred to in clause (a) of subrule (2) of rule 55, and within twelve months in the case of any other mine. The plans and sections have not been updated as required.		
Rule 34(A)	1)Every lessee having— (a) an annual excavation plan of one million tonne or more in a particular year; or (b) leased area of fifty hectare or more, shall carry out a drone survey of the leased and upto hundred metres outside the lease boundary in the month of April or May ev year and submit the processed output [digital elevation model (DEM) and Orthomos images obtained from such survey or any other format as may be specified by the In Bureau of Mines in this regard to the Controller General on or before 1st day of July year.		
	2)Every lessee, other than those covered under sub-rule (1), shall submit soft copy of high resolution Georeferenced Ortho-rectified Multispectral satellite images of the leased area and upto hundred metres outside the lease boundary taken in the month of April to June of

	Rule 45(7)	If it is found that the holder of a mining lease or the person or company engaged in trading or storage or end-use or export of minerals, as the case may be, has submitted incomplete or wrong or false information in monthly or annual returns or fails to submit a return within the date specified; then, — (a) in the case of mining of minerals by the holder of a mining lease, the Regional Controller of Mines or the authorized officer of the State Government may - Order suspension of all mining operations and dispatches in the mine and to revoke the order of suspension only after ensuring proper compliance; (b) take action to initiate prosecution under these rules; Refer PART-I Upload Document The attached Kml/Kmz file should contain the lease boundary, polygon representing the reporting year development and cumulative land use details. Refer PART-I Lease area utilisation. The details furnished are incorrect and to be in line with the features depicted in attached kml as well as the UAV data submitted in DDMS portal.

- 2. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservations and Development Rules, 2017.
- 3. Non compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR, 2017 may lead to suspension of mining operation under the provision of rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017.
- 4. You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within a period of 45 days from the date of issue of this letter.
