Sub: - Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 in respect of your **Kachhgawan Limestone Mine** over an extent of **1.821 hectares** (Mine Code 38MPR18123) situated in village Kachhgawan, Tehsil – Katni, District Katni of Madhya Pradesh State.

Sir,

Following provisions of MCDR, 2017 were found violated in your above mine during the inspection by Shri Akash Arun Mittarwar, Assistant Mining Engineer on 14/12/2024 in the presence of Shri Aditya Pandey (Mine's Representative), Shri Ritesh Kumar Dixit (Mining Engineer) & Shri Ajay Pandey (Geologists) as follows:-

11(1)	<p>No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 or approved by the competent authority of the Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research, in respect of minerals specified in Part B of the First Schedule to the Act where the grade of such atomic minerals is equal to or above the threshold value limits declared under Schedule-A of the Atomic Minerals Concession Rules, 2016.</p> <p>The Review of Mining Plan of above mentioned mine was approved vide letter No.-MP/Katni/Limestone/RMP-64/2021-22 dated 28/01/2022 incorporating proposal of working from the period 2021-22 to 2023-24 having validity up to 31/03/2024; during the inspection following violations were observed: -</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. It was proposed to drill 04 boreholes during the year 2022-23 but, the said exploration work has not been done till date; Form-I & J not submitted. 2. It was proposed to generate 2477 tonnes of OB/ Waste during the year 2023-24 but, Nil OB/ Waste is generated; therefore distorting the stripping ratio. 3. It was proposed to generate 30002 tonnes of limestone during the year 2023-24 but, only 11536 tonnes of limestone production is achieved.
33	<p>The holder of a mining lease shall, on or before the 30th day of June every year submit to the authorized Officer, as the case may be, and the State Government, a digital copy along with a print copy of the surface geological plans and sections maintained under rule 32.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copies of plans and sections under rule 32 of MCDR-2017 have not been submitted.

2. In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservations and Development Rules, 2017.
3. The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 read with MCDR-2021 (Amendment) is not found satisfactory.
4. You are advised to rectify the violations of above-mentioned rules immediately and intimate the position to this office within **45 (Forty-Five) days** from the date of issue of this letter.
