**Subject:-** Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017, in respect of your Majhgawan Diamond Mine, over an area of 162.631 hectare, situated in village-Majhgawan, Tehsil- Panna, District-Panna of Madhya Pradesh State.

Sir,

The following provisions of Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during the inspection by undersigned on 10/11/2024 in presence of Shri Mridul Dixit, (Mine Manager), Shri Santosh Pathak (Mine Geologist), and Shri Saurabh Bamouriya (Mining Engineer & QP). Violation letter no. MCDR-MiFL0Dia/1/2024-JBP-IBM\_RO\_JBP dated 27.02.2025 was issued in this regard.

11(1) of MCDR 2017	<p><b>1. Mining operations under mining lease.</b>—(1) No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operations in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Government pursuant to the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (2)</p> <p>The document of above mentioned mine was approved vide letter No. E 12159 MCDR-MPC0Dia/1/2024-JBP-IBM_RO_JBP dated 06/02/2025 incorporating proposal of working from 2025-26 to 2029-30.</p> <p>1. Pit has been developed outside the lease.</p>
45(7)	<p><b>If it is found that the holder of a mining lease or the person or company engaged in trading or storage or end-use or export of minerals, as the case may be, has submitted incomplete or wrong or false information in daily or monthly or annual returns or fails to submit a return within the date specified:</b></p> <p>In Annual Return for the year 2023-24 onwards in form G3 submitted to the Regional Controller of Mines has found following discrepancy –</p> <p>i) Reserve /resources figure furnished are wrong.</p> <p>Further, as per the provisions of Rule 62(2) Mineral Conservation and Development (Amendment) Rules, 2021, contravention of this rule shall be liable with fine for an amount as specified in Schedule II if the necessary corrections not incorporated in referred back return as per the provisions of this rule within stipulated time.</p>

- Your reply vide letter no. DMP/MP/IBM Correspondence/2020-21/555 dated 19/03/2025 in this regard has been duly considered. It has been found satisfactory for the Rule 45(7) of MCDR, 2017, but the reply for Violation of rule 11(1) of MCDR, 2017 has not been found satisfactory. Therefore, violation of Rules 11(1) of MCDR 2017 still exists in above mentioned mine.
- In this connection, it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of Mineral Conservations and Development Rules, 2017.
- The mining operations can be suspended under the rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017, if compliance of rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 is not found satisfactory.
- You are, therefore, directed to show cause within a period of 30 days from the date of issue of this letter, as to why you should not be prosecuted for the above offences.
- Please note that no further notice will be given to you in this regard.
